



## SKYLINE'S HOT APPLIED WATERPROOFING SAFETY ADVISORY

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The Hot Applied Waterproofing System shall begin commencement Monday, March 12, 2018 which will be done in sections. Each section will take approximately 7 days. Please follow the guidelines below.

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### Building Occupant Safety Guidelines

1. Hot asphalt gives off a strong odor which may be offensive to some. Those residents with allergies or breathing difficulties should remain indoors or leave the premises.
2. The sulfur compounds in roofing asphalt or coal tar have very low odor thresholds. For building occupants, smelling the odors of nearby Hot Applied Waterproofing does not indicate a harmful exposure.
3. It is recommended that during the waterproofing process, windows and balcony doors remain closed.
4. While no harm is expected, it is suggested that plants be brought in from the balcony and pets remain indoors during the process.
5. It is suggested that residents refrain from viewing the application from their balconies to avoid exposure to the fumes as this could cause tearing eyes, headache and/ or nausea.
6. All symptoms, while clearly unpleasant, are transient and can be relieved by ceasing further exposure and seeking fresh air.
7. Should you feel overexposed to roofing fumes, you should take a break in fresh air. If symptoms return, temporarily relocate yourself.

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Hot Applied Waterproofing is a necessary part of building preservation. Frequently roofing odors are generated during these projects when hot applied asphalt or coal tar are used as waterproofing materials.
